#### City Managers Report – Highlights July 12th, 2021

#### **Thank You City Staff and Volunteers**

To our Parks and Public Works Crew and Oval Beach Staff. Demands on the city infrastructure remain very high and staff has done well to manage the workload. A continued thanks, to our one current seasonal DPW staff member, Susie Smith. She has been servicing the downtown area on weekends and Holidays with a smile, we are grateful for her service.

Thank you to the Garden Club and student volunteers who maintain the beautiful annual flowers in our Commercial District.

#### 4th of July Parade and Fireworks

It's been a number of years since the Department of Public Works had a showing in the 4<sup>th</sup> of July Parade, but thanks to Scott Herbert and Cody Hardy, along with their family we had a strong showing. The parade was a success, and I was surprised to see the number of spectators. Lesson learned; be more conservative with candy distribution early-on in the parade. Thank you to the organizers, parade participants and attendees.

The fireworks were well attended with only minor incidents reported. From a cost standpoint, final invoice to city is predicted to be less than previously discussed given that many officers were able to go home early given the well-behaved crowd. A huge thanks to our local and regional emergency personnel for a job well done.

#### **Pop-up Patios**

Currently pop-up patios remove 39 parking spaces, out of roughly 726 designated spaces. A word from Kate White who is studying the issue:

For the first part of my pop-up patio project, I measured, counted, and took pictures of the existing patios in the downtown area. This consisted of measuring the length and width of the constructed patios, counting tables and seats on the on-street patios and sidewalk patios, counting the parking spaces being consumed, determining whether the patios were following the patio dimension and lighting requirements, and taking pictures of the layout and construction. After this, I created a survey for the restaurant owners that have pop-up patios, to get feedback on the permit process, the benefits/consequences of the patios for restaurants, whether or not they would like to see the policy continue post pandemic, and what kind of recommendations do

they have to make the policy more equitable for retailers. I have also been reaching out to other Michigan communities about how they approached outdoor dining in their towns, what kinds of issues they have dealt with, whether they are charging fees for the use of public parking spaces, whether they will continue the policy post pandemic, and what kind of changes would they make to their patio policy. The communication has been a good mix of phone and email contact, along with collecting documentation from other communities on resolutions and applications related to the pop-up patios. So far, I have contacted 13 other communities. Currently, I am trying to figure out the best, most efficient way to contact Saugatuck retailers, which will help the city understand pop-up patios from the perspective of store owners. I have reached out to Gregory Muncey at the Saugatuck-Douglas Area Business Association to get his help with distributing my pop-up patio survey to retailers via email. He noted that he is willing to assist with getting my survey to the retailers whose parking situation is most directly affected by the pop-up patios. I have also been working on my written report on the pop-up patios over the past two weeks, along with brainstorming potential policy recommendations going forward.

#### **Oval Beach Staffing and operations**

Oval Beach management has become stable. Our staffing is small but an elite force However, we have several interviews scheduled for additional personnel. We have increased the number of port-o-lets and servicing of the same.

#### **DPW Seasonal Staff**

Staffing seasonal work remains challenging. Scott Herbert is doing well to maintain parks and infrastructure but is concerned about personnel for remainder of summer. Scott continues to explore outside vendors to provide services and fill gaps.

#### **Blue Star Trail Update**

Contract has been executed. Committee work is underway. A meeting was conducted with emergency personnel to review preliminary design plans.

#### **Floating Homes**

Moratorium ends August 23, 2021. Planning and Zoning to review ordinance recommendations. Preliminary timeline:

- July 15, 2021 Planning Commission makes a recommendation following Public Hearing (or a special meeting the following week if necessary)
- July 26, 2021 Ordinances introduced to Council for first reading (Council may waive first reading and adopt immediately if they want to do that.)
- August 9, 2021 Council action on the ordinances to adopt
- August 19, 2021 Publications of ordinances effective date August 26, 2021 (or publish in Holland Sentinel on ~August 12 or 13, 2021 for an effective date of July 22 or 23, 2021)
- August 23 Moratorium expires
- Effective date: August 26, 2021

The possible short cuts – special meetings, waive first reading, publish in the Sentinel rather than the Commercial Record.

#### **Dune Ridge Updates**

No update- following guidance provided by Council at their special meeting held in April. Zoning Board of Appeals meeting was continued to 7.14.21. City staff has been directed to bring-on interim legal counsel and planning and zoning consultant to assist with the process.

#### Road resurfacing (and utility) projects

**Park Street-** Discussions on the project will likely include adding waterline service replacement to the scope causing further delays on the project.

**Campbell Road** The city agreed to proceed a grant for the project. If the grant is not awarded, the project can be completed fall of '21. If the grant is awarded the project would become a spring '22 project. This is a shared project with Douglas.

Mill Street- To receive millings from the North Park Street project sometime during this summer.

#### Radar Signs & temporary traffic light & pedestrian crossing

Radar sign ordered for Blue Star Highway. Working with Allegan County Sheriff Department on deployment.

Staff reviewed pedestrian crossing signs near the Chain Ferry last week with the engineer.

#### Milfoil update

First treatment conducted on schedule. Next full treatment planned for July 28<sup>th</sup>; those who wish to participate will need to let the City know by the 23<sup>rd</sup>.


#### **AT&T Cellular Facilities**



WHEREAS, the FOTBST is requesting that Saugatuck Township, the City of the Village of Douglas, and the City of Saugatuck ("Communities" or "Community" as appropriate) jointly accept responsibility to construct a section of the Blue Star Trail, from Washington Street in the City of the Village of Douglas, through the City of Saugatuck, and into Saugatuck Township terminating at Holland Street; and

WHEREAS, while unknown at this time, the FOTBST estimate the cost of the portion of the Blue Star Trail to be constructed within the Communities would be between \$1,000,000 and \$2,000,000, to be paid using state grants (75%) and a local match (25%); and

WHEREAS, the Communities need to collaborate regarding such topics as staff resources, engineering/construction costs, on-going maintenance costs and replacement costs in order to construct and operate the proposed section of Blue Star Trail, and recognize that these activities would involve expenditures for the Communities, which funds are currently not available or limited.

# NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. The Communities reaffirm their support for the Blue Star Trail.
- 2. A Joint Study Committee will be formed by the Communities, the FOTBST, and the Allegan County Road Commission with two (2) voting members appointed by each municipality, agency, or corporation.
- 3. The Manager from each Community will serve as an ex-officio member with the right to discuss and debate but without the power to vote.
- 4. The Joint Study Committee will elect a chairperson and vice chairperson, and conduct meetings in compliance with the Open Meetings Act.
- 5. The Study Committee will be tasked with drafting an intergovernmental agreement, including but not limited to provisions that address:
  - a. The scope and nature of the project;

The potential lead (Act 51) agency for grant funding and oversight; b.

Responsibilities for preparing grant applications and for bidding and awarding c.

contracts;

Indemnification and insurance requirements;

Expenses and responsibilities for the construction, maintenance and future operations; e.

f. Possible funding options available to the Communities, and the funding of the local

match required;

g. The route of the trail; and,

The engineer of record. h.

6. The Joint Study Committee will use its best efforts to complete its work and present a draft

agreement and written report to the Communities no later than June 1, 2021.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that notwithstanding any specific resolution already

rescinded by the Communities, this resolution supersedes any prior resolutions to the extent that it may

conflict with the provisions of this resolution.

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED this resolution shall become effective only in the event that

the governing body for each of the Communities adopts it in the form and substance as set forth herein.

Thereafter, the last date of approval shall be considered its effective date.


