CONSTRUCTION NOTICE

The City is planning on beginning the **State Street** reconstruction project from **Pleasant Street to Lake Street** the week of March 15th. Cold weather, excessive rain or road weight restrictions may affect the schedule.

The contractor anticipates removing pavement first then beginning installation of water main and storm sewer. Rough road grading, sand, gravel and concrete curbing will be installed next. Then final grading, paving and restoration will take place.

The work is expected to take approximately 4 weeks but will be very weather dependent this time of year. Paving could also be delayed dependent on the opening of the asphalt plant in the spring. The City does not expect sewer shutoffs. However, any water shutoffs should be short (less than 2 hours) while services are being re-connected. Property owners will get advance notice of water shutoffs.

All property owners must be aware that work will be taking place within the entire right-of-way, not just under the paved surface. If you have placed landscaping fence, irrigation or other items in the right-of-way, there is a good chance they will be removed or damaged. If you want to preserve any of these, please remove them from the right-of-way prior to construction. The contractor or City cannot be responsible for protecting these items.

The City will be working to minimize any problems that develop during the construction project. The contractor will be required to maintain traffic and emergency access to the properties. In general, access will be available although it may be necessary to wait a few minutes while equipment is moved.

Driveway access will generally be available except when concrete is being poured or curing in the driveway, sidewalk or curb across the driveway. The contractor will notify property owners a day ahead of time so your vehicle can be parked in the street. Mail service will not be disrupted, although if you have a curbside mailbox, it may be temporarily relocated to a nearby point that the post office can easily access.
